

Means 'wild turkey' (C)

Though Blake & Breen reported earlier it was extinct, Sutton contacted one full speaker and another whose first language is the closely related dialect, *Ngawun*. Breen has since also collected a little. This is a case for urgent salvage.

Three words for 'man' have been listed: *bandjil*,
yalmid, *bama* (PS); ("*Mycoolan*" in C has *bunjil*)

Is mutually intelligible with *Maygulan*. Sutton has recorded from at least one remaining speaker, and Breen obtained a little also from him at Poseidon Downs in 1972. Blake (1971) found one speaker at Aitkenvale, Townsville and another reported at Normanton. Thus the language is probably salvageable but the task is urgent.

Palmer gives the location as Saxby River. Turnbull has a brief outline grammar and 23 words in 'Science of Man' (v.6,:1, 1903) not listed in 'RLS'. Two other vocabularies in Curr have been identified by Sutton, No. 91, Mouth of Leichhardt River pp.304-5; and No. 95, Leichhardt River below Kamaroli Station
