Also means 'that' (Glasgow)

Gunarda (Glasgow, AIAS), *Kun-narda* (Glasgow); *Anbarda*
(a sub-dialect meaning "river mouth" - (Glasgow))

Included in Glasgow's *Burera* studies.

21. B. GOROGONIC GROUP

A multiple classifying group with a fairly elaborate tense system.

21. Gorogone *** South of Tompkinson N39 (AIAS N75)
River (AC)

Gungorogone (AC, orig. AIAS, Kyle-Little), *Gorogone*
(O'G, 'RLS', SAW), *Gudjertabia* (alt. name - Glasgow)

Said to be close to *Burera* but no major study yet undertaken.

IX. NUNGGUBUYAN FAMILY

Characterized by a highly developed system of noun classification (15 classes) and very complex verb structure (7 orders of prefixes and 2 of suffixes). It is also unique in the system of numerals (it has the usual quinary system with a mechanism to expand upwards indefinitely).

Phonologically it has the maximum stop-nasal contrasts at six linear points, (but no glottal), 3 1 phonemes, r, 3 semi-vowels, 5 vowels. Stress patterns are: V, VC, CV, CVC and CVCC.

Nunggubuya (T, AC, AIAS, Hughes, Leeding); *Wubay* (alt.
 name - Hughes). Moieties: *Mandirrija*, (*Yirritja*),
Mandhaayung (*Dhuwa*) (Hughes)

Hughes has studied in depth over the past several years and produced a number of papers: *Nunggubuyu* phonemes and noun clauses (with V. J. Leeding), and verbs (with A. Healey) (all in *Papers on the Languages of Australia*, 1971), a set of primers, *Nunggubuyu-English* dictionary (*Oceania Monograph*, 1971) and "Tales of the *Nunggubuyu* Tribe" (16 legends, *Numbulwar Mission*, 1969). There are c. 400 speakers today now living mostly at *Numbulwar Mission* (mouth of *Rose River*), *Groote Eylandt* and *Roper River*, but those at the latter have mostly lost the ability to use their mother tongue.

23. X. ANDILYAUGWAN [O'G: GROOTE EYLANDTAN] FAMILY

Classificatory family and language name used by O'G have been changed from the locational *Groote Eylandtan* to the linguistic *Andilyaugwan* by Wurm. It has very similar construction, phonemically and grammatically to *Nunggubuyu*, 22; though it has only four vowels.
