20. A. BURERIC GROUP

Burera has 13 consonant and 5 vowels phonemes with only one laminal series, alveopalatal. Stress falls on the first syllable of the word stem and syllable patterns are C, V, VC, CV, CVC, CVCC, CVCCC,
