De?ynegmi (AIAS), *De?ynekmi* (Harris, SAW), *Gunde?ngekmi* (11.2 'RLS'), *Gundenekmi* (Harris)

Originally listed as an alternative name for *Gundangbon* 11.2 'RLS', but Harris' study places it as a *Gunwinjgu* dialect.

11.1c* Djebmi *

Djebmi (AIAS), *Gundjepmi*, *Djepmi* (Harris, SAW), *Gundj-
eipmi*, *Gundeidjeme* (44Nr. 'RLS'; AC, Harris)

Investigated by Harris - see her *Gunbalang Grammar* (1970).

[11.1d Gumadir *]

Gumidir (O'G, 'RLS', SAW, AIAS)

Deleted as now known to be a river name. Hence Wurm's 1970 classification is incorrect. People from this area (between Oenpelli and Maningrida) have been called "*Maiali*" by aborigines from Oenpelli.

11.2a* Gunbalang * Mouth of Liverpool N34 (AIAS N69)
(12) River (Harris)

Gunbalang (Harris, Berndt, SAW, AIAS), *Gunba:lang* (AC, APE)

Originally classified in 'AL' as comprising the Girdimarg Subgroup but Harris and Wurm reclassify as a *Gunwinjgu* dialect. It is the subject of Harris' PhD. thesis (1970). Most of the people live a semi-nomadic existence based at Maningrida on the Liverpool River and at the Oenpelli Mission. There is a small group at Goulburn Island. (Harris)
