

114.1* Wik Ngandjara *** On coast between Y100 (AIAS Y59)
(30Yr.) mouth of Kendell
& Holroyd Rivers
(T's map)

(25Yr.) *Wik Ngandjara* (AC, AIAS, 'RLS' 30Yr.), *Nantjara*,
Ngantjeri (LMW); *Algan* (AC, Y7, AIAS, Y49, 'RLS' 25Yr.)
Alken (BS), *Alkin*, *Alkan*, probably *Wik Natanja* (T),
Wik Ngadara (S. of Cape Keer Weer - McC)

Some older fluent speaker still live at Aurukun - possibly known to 20-30 people still. Possibly will be available from fluent speakers for next 5 years. West took a word list and a bora song. Kilham says *Wik Ngandjara* is used as a cover term for several Gugu - languages (*Mumenh*, *Mu?in*, *Ugbanh* and *Uwanh*)

114.2* Wik Muminh ** Coastal area south Y91 (AIAS Y43)
(106.4) of mouth of Holroyd
River (BS map)

Wik Muminh (O'G, 'RLS', BAS, KL, 'AL'), *Mumanh* (BS, CK)

Hale distinguishes 2 orders of stops and one of nasals at 5 linear points of articulation, glottal, l, r, w, R, y and 3 vowels. Kilham says c. 30 speakers remain at Aurukun and Edward River.

114.3a* Wik Me?an ** North of Randall River Y87 (AIAS Y53)
(106.5) a little inland from
mouth of Tor (?) River
(BS map)

Wik Me?an (KH, BS), *Wik Me?nh* (BAS), *Wikmei'an* (McC),
Wik Me?nha ('AL') *Mejan* (AC, orig. AIAS), *Wikmean*
(alt. 'LS', O'G, 'RLS'), *Wik Me'ana* ('LS')

McConnel says they are distinguished by the *Wik Munggan* people as those who speak *Me'anbaka*. Hale distinguishes only one order of stops (+glottal) but 6 vowels and length on 4 of them. There are only about a dozen speakers at Aurukun.

'man' : *pama* (CK)
