

not a dialect name. (WHD). Bates mentions *Djidji* 'west of Boundary Dam' but this does not appear to be a dialect name.

56.2k Madoitja A20 (AIAS A41)

*Madoidja* (AIAS), *Madoitja* (T, SAW), *Waianwonga* (DB), *Wainawonga* (Hermann)

Location given by Daisy Bates as Lake Nabberu. She claims to have collected myths and legends but these are probably in one of what she terms the Murchison languages, possibly *Ngadawanga*, 56.2m. von Brandenstein says the word is *Marduidja* and is a locational not a tribal or language name, meaning 'low land'. It refers he says to *Njijapali* (50.3a) territory.

56.2-1 Konin A15 (AIAS A35)

*Gonin* (AIAS), *Konin* (T, O'G, SAW)

Apart from Tindale's map, Davidson's register of tribes and the O'Grady - Wurm classifications, there is no linguistic information on this group, so its identity is questionable.

56.2p Ngurlu A27 (AIAS A10)

Means 'fear' or 'afraid' (WHD)

Douglas' meaning of the word suggests this is not a dialect name, though Capell's comment in 'LS' cannot be ignored - viz: "Nothing recorded and probably unavailable if Tindale is correct in saying that after 1890 it was overwhelmed by the westward movement of *Waljen* and *Nangadadjara* tribes." (AC)

56.2q Maduwonga (deleted) Kalgoorlie area (T's map)

Means 'talk using *maḍu* for "man"'

*Jindi* (Craig), *Maduwonga* (O'G, 'RLS'), *Mardowonga* (SAW), *Marduwonga*, *Mardudjara*, *Maduwongga*

No new light has been shed on this dialect name.
