

Distinguishing characteristics:

'this' : *ngaanya*

 (Herrmann); modern southern
 neighbours of the *Baljgu*
 (von B)

A derogatory term meaning 'those who are impotent or unable', from *purd* 'potent, able'; *-di* 'less, without'; *-tjara* 'with, having' (von B) *pawutu* means 'before, previously' in the Mt. Margaret dialect.

Bawududjara (AC), *Budidjara* (AC, Tonkinson, Herrmann), *Pawututjara* (O'G), *Puditjarra* (von B), *Puditara*, *Pututjara*, *Purditjara* (all originally listed in 'RLS' under *Pini*, 56.2r) *Putitjara* (Lindgren), *Puudditjarra* (von B)

von Brandenstein has collected a little material from the only two informants at Jigalong who know a little. Apparently the language has now become so fused with *Gardudjara* it is difficult to separate distinctive vocabulary and suffixual differences. von Brandenstein says a possible interesting relationship between *Budidjara* and *Dargudi*, 56.2d* should be investigated. The name used by O'Grady and Wurm, *Pawututjara*, could not be found in the literature (*pawutu* means 'before').
