A derogatory term meaning 'those who are impotent or unable', from *purd* 'potent, able'; -*di* 'less, without'; -*tjara* 'with, having' (von B) *pawutu* means 'before, previously' in the Mt. Margaret dialect.

von Brandenstein has collected a little material from the only two informants at Jigalong who know a little.

Apparently the language has now become so fused with *Gardudjara* it is difficult to separate distinctive vocabulary and suffixal differences. von Brandenstein says a possible interesting relationship between *Budidjara* and *Dargudi*, 56.2d* should be investigated. The name used by O'Grady and Wurm, *Pawututjara*, could not be found in the literature (*pawutu* means 'before').
