Central Nyungar dialect agreed upon by all recent investigators.

Wirtimay (SAW, AIAS), *Witimay* ('RLS')

Listed in 'RLS' as *Witimay*, an alternate spelling for *Widi*, 53.5b. Wurm includes this name but it is not mentioned by Douglas or von Brandenstein.

54.1f* Djabanmay Wubin, New Norcia area,
and east to No. 1. Rabbit
Proof Fence (WHD map)

Djabanmay (AIAS), *Tjapanmay* (SAW, WHD)

Mapped by Douglas 1967 and classified by Wurm 1970. One of the three dialect names for Perth Nyungar on Douglas' 1967 map.

54.2a* Wudjari Doubtful Bay to W39 (AIAS W8)

Israelite Bay (DB)
Around Esperance from
at least Young River to
Cape Arid, and north to
Scadden (von B)

Means 'quickly running away' from *(w)udja* 'to run away' + *-(ng)arri* plural; not a Nyungar word but from *Ngadju* (von B)

Wudjaarri (von B), *Wudjari* (T, AC, AIAS, O'G, 'RLS', von B), *Watjari* (WHD, SAW), *Warrangoo* (C), *Wanttandee*,
