

If this dialect mentioned by one of Breen's informants exists, it would be classified here.

- 75.3 Badjiri Paroo River, Cunnamulla, D2 (AIAS D31)  
Currawinya (GB)

*Badjiri* (AC, SAW, O'G, 'RLS', GB, AIAS), *Badyiri* or *Badyidi* (used by all present day informants - GB), *Badjari* (AC), *Budtjerri* ('LS'), *Baddyeri* (RHM), *Poidgerry* (Myles), *Badieri* (Thomas)

On present evidence it has a fairly high cognate count with *Marganj*, 100.le, of the Pama-Maric Subgroup, viz 26%, but Breen thinks it rightly belongs as classified here. It's cognate count with *Garlali* is 56%. A feature which was apparently borrowed from the Mari languages is the presence of bound pronominal forms (unlike other members of this group). Breen has recorded a small corpus, including Mathews vocabulary (1972). It is doubtful if salvagable amounts could still be collected from a possible 2 remaining informants.

'man' : *karna* (GB)

76. e\*. *Varli* Subgroup

Locationally the following are New South Wales or South Australian languages but they have obvious linguistic affiliations with the rest of the Karnic Group. The standing of the subgroup as a whole has not been recently assessed.

- 76a Garanggaba ? L12 (AIAS L15)

*Garanggaba* (AC, AIAS), *Karenggapa* (O'G, 'RLS')

Not included by Wurm in his 1970 classification, thus possibly not a language name at all as no information exists.

- 76b Wadigali L27 (AIAS L12)

*Wadigali* (AC, AIAS), *Wadikali* (SAW, O'G, 'RLS')
