Holmer has gathered a reasonable amount of data in the Cherbourg - Brisbane area and hopes to be able to give a fairly full description of the language.

Hall (1970) and Holmer (1972) have gathered some remnants. The latter states it is preferable to consider Wuli-Wuli as an independent language, parallel to Waga-Waga Within this group of languages.
