This is the dialect the Geytenbeeks have studies in depth with 42 months field work, producing a full grammar and vocabulary of several hundred words. There are about two dozen remaining speakers.

Means 'those who say gali for 'this' (in sight) (GB)

Wurm has deleted as a Bandjalang dialect but Geytenbeek lists as a dialect with a few remaining speakers.

92d\* We:labal \* Tabulum, Clarence River (AIAS E16.2\*) area (GB)

Means 'those who say we:lu 'you' ' (BG)

We: labal (BG), Welabal (SAW)

Also newly listed by Geytenbeek and Wurm.

92e\* Wudjebal \* East of Tenterfield E62 (AIAS E16) (92.1f) (BG map)

Means 'those who say wudje 'you' (BG) (not wu:ye - C/S - as in 'RLS')

Wudjebal (BG, SAW), Widjabal (AC, AIAS, O'G, 'RLS'), (Delete Wijabal, Wiyebal given as alt. names in 'RLS' as these refer to Wiyabal, 92h\*)
