

This is the dialect the Geytenbeeks have studied in depth with 42 months field work, producing a full grammar and vocabulary of several hundred words. There are about two dozen remaining speakers.

'person' : *baygal* (BG)

- 92b* Dinggabal * Upper reaches of (AIAS E16.1*)
Clarence River in area
between Woodenbong (NSW)
and Stanthorpe (Q) (BG)

Means 'those who say *dingga* 'That's right!' (BG)

Dinggabal (BG, SAW), *Gindobal* ?, *Djinggebal*

Newly listed by Geytenbeek and Wurm.

- 92c* Galibal * Kyogle area (BG map) E24 (AIAS E15)
(92.Id)

Means 'those who say *gali* for 'this' (in sight) (GB)

Galibal (BG), *Kalibal* (O'G, 'RLS'), Nyung ? (Richmond River - Livingstone)

Wurm has deleted as a *Bandjalang* dialect but Geytenbeek lists as a dialect with a few remaining speakers.

- 92d* We:labal * Tabulum, Clarence River (AIAS E16.2*)
area (GB)

Means 'those who say *we:lu* 'you' ' (BG)

We:labal (BG), *We:labal* (SAW)

Also newly listed by Geytenbeek and Wurm.

- 92e* Wudjebal * East of Tenterfield E62 (AIAS E16)
(92.If) (BG map)

Means 'those who say *wudje* 'you' (BG) (not *wu:ye* - C/S - as in 'RLS')

Wudjebal (BG, SAW), *Widjebal* (AC, AIAS, O'G, 'RLS'), (Delete *Wijebal*, *Wiyebal* given as alt. names in 'RLS' as these refer to *Wiyebal*, 92h*)

Just a few speakers remained in 1972.

92f* Bandjalang * Southern extremity of E3 (AIAS E12)
(92.1h) the group; east of
Baryugil to coast
between Evans Head & a
little north of Ballina (NG)

Bandjalang (AC, AIAS, BG, SAW, NH), *Bandjalong* (WGH),
Bandjelang (O'G, 'RLS'), *Bandjeleng* (T)

Holmer has worked on this dialect.

'man' : *baygul, bygal* (C: 178)

92g* Manaldjali Beaudesert area (Q)

Manaldjali, Malandjali, Munnandjali (all NH), *Manaldjali*
('RLS' alt. name for *Yugumbir*, 92.2)

Holmer has collected material from informants at Beau-
desert and these react to this being an independent
form of *Bandjalang*. Holmer calls it the 'Beaudesert
language' and says his best informants call it *Munnand-*
jali. He lists at least four informants (1970).

Holmer says the modern language clearly corresponds to
a vocabulary by F. T. Watson in Supplement to Royal
Geographical Society (34, XLVIII). He has also ident-
ified a word list in Curr by Sheridan and Bay (No. 174,
pp. 253-5).

'man' : *murri/murdi* (C:174)

92h* Wiyabal North east from Lismore E61 (AIAS E.15.1*)
(92.1f) (BG)

Means 'those who say *wiya* for "you" ' (BG)

Wiyabal (BG, SAW, AIAS), *Wijabal, Widjabal* (AC, O'G,
'RLS'), *Minyung* ? (Byron Bay - Livingstone)

92i* Ngara:ngbal North east extremity of group;
(92.1g?) on coast from a little south
of Tweed Heads north to mouth
of Logan River (BG map)
