Holmer has collected material from informants at Beaudesert and these react to this being an independent form of Bandjalang. Holmer calls it the 'Beaudesert language' and says his best informants call it Munnandjali. He lists at least four informants (1970). Holmer says the modern language clearly corresponds to a vocabulary by F. T. Watson in Supplement to Royal Geographical Society (34, XLVIII). He has also identified a word list in Curr by Sheridan and Bay (No. 174, pp. 253-5).
