 & Urandangie on Georgia

 Pituri Creek at Wolga  
 (Walgra) (T)

*Elookera* (R), *Maula* (O'G), *Maule* (T, KH, orig. AIAS),  
*Mawula* (AC), (this name not recognised today GB says),  
*Wallawarra* (Edge), *Walookera* (APE, Edge, Meggitt),  
*Warluwara* (GB), *Walugera* (KH), *Waluwara* (KH), *Wollegara*,  
*Walukara* (R), (name used by some neighbouring tribes -  
 GB) *Yunnalinka* (R - probably a horde name - GB)

Roth, Dutton and Edge are 3 old vocabularies not listed  
 in 'RLS' of 100 words, 30 words and a brief vocabulary  
 and description respectively. The three sub-tribes or  
 hordes are *Kapula* (Carandotta), *Parnkara* (Rochedale  
 area and west to Headingly), and *Warluwara* proper  
 (Walgra and Urandangie area). The other names in the  
 area not clear are: *Manda* and *Paringkarami*; *Yunnalinka*  
 (said by Roth to be at Carandotta) and *Wonganja*  
 (G11, 8Gr.). Capell placed the latter east of *Warluwara*.

Breen continues to collect material for a depth study,  
 the most recent data being collected in 1971 and 1972  
 when two hours of useful material was elicited. Breen  
 considers more material may still be collected.

Word for 'man' : *thawa* (GB)
