Wurm has tentatively classified as the Walangamic Group but Sutton feels is probably a dialect of *Gunggara* so has tentatively been thus reclassified.

 (66Yr.) 17°20'S, Long. 145E
 on top of Gt. Dividing
 Range c. 70 miles inland
 from Cairns, bounded on
 north by Walsh River &
 including present town-
 ships of Petford & Irvine-
 bank (not as far as Mareeba
 to north-east, Almaden to
 west or Mt. Garnet to
 south-east) (RMD)

Ba:berem (T), *Barbaram* (AC, AIAS, 'RLS' 66Yr.),
Wumbabaram ('RLS')

Dixon found two old vocabularies, one by Tindale of 120 words taken at Mona Mona in 1938 and one in Mathews' Eaglehawk and Crow' under the name 'Walsh River language'. Dixon is continuing earlier salvage work on the language. His present material includes a 250 word vocabulary, a phonological statement and a sketch grammar.

'man' : mog / mug; ('body' is aba; 'belly' is mba) (RMD)

Gudhand (GB), *Gudanda* ('RLS' 16Gr., SAW), *Kutanda*
 (Sharp), *Godhanda* (BAS, PS), *Goothanto* (RHM)

This dialect has been classified here tentatively. Both Sommer and Breen agree it is not a dialect of *Gunggara*: Sommer says 'something else': Breen suggests may be another language in the same subgroup. Hence its listing here.

Kuandar (BAS), *Guandhar* (GB), *Gwandar*

Breen & Sommer confirm Sutton's tentative assessment of this being a dialect of *Gunggara*. Breen has obtained salvageable amounts from three different people (1972). Wurm's very tentative classification in a separate (Karantic) group has thus not been confirmed. Sommer now (1975) identifies as *Nar* 119.2b.

- 120.lc*? Garandi ? **** Flinders River G8 (AIAS G32)
(3Gr.) area, inland about
20 miles to about
another 40 miles

Karundi (T), *Garundi* (AC, AIAS, 'RLS' 3Gr.), *Garandi* (PS), *Gar-und-yih* (Turnbull), *Karrandee* (C), *Karrandi* (Gigliolo), *Karantee* (RHM), *Karunti* (Davidson), *Korindee* (Howitt)

Sharp suggests this is the same as *Guandhar* above, but Sutton thinks they are separate and that *Garundi* may be affiliated with *Gugadji*. Breen however disagrees. He says Curr's *Karrantee* is Southern Pama, not related to *Gugadji*.

- 120.ld* Ngarab ** Coastal area, north of Y13 (AIAS Y107)
(60Yr.) Gilbert River

Ngarab (BAS, AIAS), *Ngarap* (BAS), *Areba* (PS), *'Araba* (AC, AIAS, 'RLS' 60Yr.), *Rib* (GB), *Rip* (BAS) *Kumerrmal* ? (name of language spoken by *Rib* people according to an informant of GB)

Sommer recorded from an informant at Normanton 1972. Breen has also recorded.

'aboriginal man' : a:bm (PS); a:m (BS) (?)
