

120.2d\* Yanga \*\*\*\* Head of Gilbert River Y63 (AIAS Y131)  
(100.3h)

*Yanga* (AIAS), *Janga*: (T), *Jangaa* (O'G, 'RLS')

Salvage amounts may remain in the Normanton area but Breen collected none in his 1972 survey. Sutton maps territory as probably being directly west of *Agwamin* territory. (The comment in 'RLS' it is connected to *Njangga* is incorrect.)

120.2e\* Mbara \*\*\*\* Headwaters of Norman G25 (AIAS G18)  
(100.3g)  
(1Gr.) River; between Richmond & Forsyth (PS)

*Mbara* (PS, Sharp), *Ambara* (AC G1, AIAS G21, 'RLS' 1Gr.), *Mitjamba* ('RLS' 100.3g, O'G), *Midjamba* (AC G25, AIAS G18), *Mbarra* (GB)

Sutton discovered his *Mbara* and Tindale's *Mitjamba* are different names for the one dialect which is mutually intelligible with *Yanga*. Breen collected a little material from a limited informant in 1972 and agrees with Sutton that it belongs to Southern Pama. Sutton had earlier recorded a little from the same informant and marked it a case for urgent salvage to allow clarification of some tantalising data.

'man' : *ma* / *ma:* (also word for 'body'); 'back' is *mok* (PS)

120.2f\* Dagalag \*\*\*\* Middle Gilbert River Y29 (AIAS Y125)  
(100.3i) & around Croydon (PS)

*Dagalag* (AC, GB, AIAS, PS), *Tagalag* (T, O'G, 'RLS'), *Ndagalag* (PS)

Breen agrees with Sutton's tentative classification that *Dagalag* and *Mbara* are both Southern Paman. Breen interviewed three possible informants in 1972 but was unable to collect anything of significance. There is still hope something may yet be collected.

120.3\* ? Walangama ? \*\*\*\* East and a G34 (AIAS G36)  
(12Gr.) little to the south of Normanton (PS); near Croydon (informant of GB)

*Walangama* (AC, AIAS, 'RLS' 12Gr.), *Wallungameo* (Howitt)  
*Wallungarma* (RHM), *Wollangama* (R, JM, Fraser),  
*Wollongurmee* (Armit)

Wurm has tentatively classified as the Walangamic Group but Sutton feels is probably a dialect of *Gunggara* so has tentatively been thus reclassified.

120.4 ? Mbabaram ? \* Small area round Lat. Y16 (AIAS Y115)  
(66Yr.) 17°20'S, Long. 145E  
on top of Gt. Dividing  
Range c. 70 miles inland  
from Cairns, bounded on  
north by Walsh River &  
including present town-  
ships of Petford & Irvine-  
bank (not as far as Mareeba  
to north-east, Almaden to  
west or Mt. Garnet to  
south-east) (RMD)

*Ba:berem* (T), *Barbaram* (AC, AIAS, 'RLS' 66Yr.),  
*Wumbabaram* ('RLS')

Dixon found two old vocabularies, one by Tindale of 120 words taken at Mona Mona in 1938 and one in Mathews' Eaglehawk and Crow' under the name 'Walsh River language'. Dixon is continuing earlier salvage work on the language. His present material includes a 250 word vocabulary, a phonological statement and a sketch grammar.

120.5\*? Gudhand\* ?  
(16Gr.)

*Gudhand* (GB), *Gudanda* ('RLS' 16Gr., SAW), *Kutanda*  
(Sharp), *Godhanda* (BAS, PS), *Goothanto* (RHM)

This dialect has been classified here tentatively. Both Sommer and Breen agree it is not a dialect of *Gunggara*: Sommer says 'something else': Breen suggests may be another language in the same subgroup. Hence its listing here.
