

- 61.2 Banggala (Pangkala) Port Lincoln to L2a (AIAS L6)
head of Spencer
Gulf (AC)

Bangala (Sch), *Banggala* (AIAS), *Ba:nggala* (AC, APE),
Ba:njgala (LH), *Kortabina* (C), *Pangkala* (T, O'G, 'RLS'),
Pankala (Worms), *Pankarla* (O'G), *Parnkalla* (Schur,
Taplin)

Schurmann's vocabulary shows an asymmetrical phonology - no alveolar stop and no word beginning with a - he has words beginning with *i* and *u* but he probably failed to hear word initial *y* and *w*. It has an estimated shared basic vocabulary with *Mirninj*, 55.1a* of 22% and with *Arabana*, 73a, of 15% (O'G-K). Hercus has salvaged what remains of this dialect, which might supplement O'Grady's as yet unpublished material.

Distinguishing features:

'this' : *inna*
'many' : *ngalla*
'go' : *nguka*
'I' (trans): *ngatto*; (also *ngai*)
'man' : *yura* (O'G-K)

- 61.3 Guyani West side of Flinders L15 (AIAS L9)
Range, north end of
Lake Torrens

Gujani (AC, LH, orig. AIAS), *Guyani* (AIAS), *Kooyiannie* (C), *Kuyani* (SAW, O'G, 'RLS', Howitt), *Kujani* (Sch., Reuther)

Hercus' salvage has been extended by the discovery of a 90 year old *Arabana* speaker of *Guyani* ancestry who remembered her *Guyani* with great fluency (1972). This should supplement what Schebeck gathered (1966?) and with fragments of *Nugunu* and *Banggala* be enough for comparison with *Adnjamadana*.

- 61.4 Adnjamadana- Western slopes of L43 (AIAS L10,17.1)
northern Flinders
Ranges (LH)
Wailbi Blinman and Parachilna (AC)

Adn'amatana (Sch), *Adnjamadana* (AIAS), *Andjamatana* (Sch), *Adnyamatana* (SAW), *Anjamatana* (C, Mountford); *Umbertana* (place name - C): *Wailbi* (AC, APE, AIAS), *Wailpi* (RMB, O'G, 'RLS'), *Ararru* and *Mathari* - names of two matrilineal moieties (LH)

Wailbi is a subgroup of *Adnjamadana* and sometimes covers it or is an alternate name for it. Wurm (1970) listed separately but it appears they are linguistically one unit. In 1965 it was estimated there were over 30 speakers in the Leigh Creek, Innamincka, Nepabunna region, children as well as adults speaking it. Others live at Copley, Beltana, Hawker, Quorn, and the greatest number of all at Port Augusta. (LH) (Note: *Archualda* should be deleted from the list of alternate names in 'RLS', 61.4, p 92) Hercus has been working on this dialect in collaboration with Schebeck, especially on the pronouns and kinship system in relation to the pronominal usage as seen from the viewpoint of female Ego. Schebeck has written "Adnyamatana Pronouns and the Wailpi Kinship System" ed. L.A. Hercus & I.M. White. (AIAS, 1974)

- 61.5a Yardliyawara Eastern side of L12 (AIAS L7)
northern Flinders
Range

Derived from *yardli* 'man' and *yawara* 'word', 'language'

Jadliaura (T, AC, orig. AIAS, O'G, 'RLS'), *Yadliaura* (SAW), *Yadliyawara* (SAW), *Yardliyawara* (LH, AIAS)

Closely related to *Adnjamadana*. Hercus has collected one tape of vocabulary and phrases (1971) from one informant. She says there are similarities with the *Yarli* Subgroup, especially to *Maljangaba*, 76c, so there is doubt whether to classify here or there.

'man' : *jura mira* ('man': *mira*) (JHM); *yardli* (LH)

Gulf to Broughton River
& from Crystal Brook
north to Port Augusta;
east to Melrose, Gladstone
& north to Quorn; at
Baroota (AC & LH)

- 21Gr. *Kokonari* Same as *Gugu Nar* or *Gundara*, 119.2b*
- 22Gr. *Jangrala* No further information.
- 23Gr. *Gulbilangu* Same as *Indjiladji* (GB), 68.2b*.
- 24Gr. *Jura* Reported by an informant of Breen's to be a language name of the Boulia area.

7B. RESIDUE LANGUAGES LAKES AREA (AREA L)

- 1Lr. *Mamwura* Breen suggests the name *Mamwura* listed by Beckett is a mis-hearing of *Mambangura*, a name given him by one of his informants. Capell gives the location north of Nerialco (that is, Naryilco), which is approximately the Nockatunga area where another informant of Breen's placed *Ngandangura*, 75.1b. Hence it is probably an alternate name for it.
- 2Lr. *Mundabara* No information except Capell's listing, L33.
- 3Lr. *Midhaga* A *Diyaric* language (Karnic Group), 74.1f*.
- 4Lr. *Waidjinga* No fresh information L42 (AIAS L21)
- 5Lr. *Adnjamadana* See 6l.4b*.
- 6Lr. *Nanduwara* No further information S50 (AIAS L3.1)
- 7Lr. *Dirari* Karna Subgroup, 74.1b*.
- 8Lr. *Parpagunu* Only fresh information is Breen's spelling of *Pałpakunu*, said to be derived from *pałpa* 'tongue'; *kunu* 'other'.
- 9Lr. *Minkabari* No new information.
- 10Lr. *Balpamadramadra* Breen further reports that this may be the same language as that shown on a map by Howitt marked *Dirityangura*, (A word list in 'AR' by Howitt, No. 49, Vol 2., pp.30-1, which Breen once thought may have been this language, is now known to be *Diyari*, 74.1a.)
- 11Lr. *Mambangura* No further information.
- 12Lr. *Jaramarla* Breen now spells *Jaramarala*.
- 13Lr. *Wongadjaga* Part of *Arabana*. See 73c*.
- 14Lr. *Ganjamadna* Deleted. Another spelling of *Adnjamadana*, 5Lr. above, 6l.4b*.
