III. KAKADJUAN (O'G: KAKADUAN) FAMILY

Features a multiple-classifying system with two genders. It has similarities with the Kimberley languages Ngarinyin and Wurora (46.la and 47.1). (SAW)

6. Gagadju *** Between East and N26 (AIAS N50)
South Alligator Rivers

Gagadu (Carroll), Gagadju (AC, SAW, Court, AIAS), Kakadu (T, O'G, 'RLS'), Abdedal, Abiddul, Kakata, Karkardoo (all 'RLS') (Kukata as listed in 'RLS' probably refers to 'RLS' 56.2ac)

Court's unpublished data (1962) is the only recent data. There appears still to be a few speakers about - Osborne reported finding 5 at Berrimah in 1972, but the need to fully document this language soon is reasonably urgent.

- IV. MENGEREIAN (O'G: MANGERIAN) FAMILY
- A. MENGEREIIC (O'G: MANGERIC) GROUP

Prefixing language which Harris shows has five structural points in common with neighbouring languages, principally in verb and pronoun structure. Harris (1969) confirms the following three languages belong to the Mengereian Family.

7. Mengerei **** Oenpelli region N53 (AIAS N53)

Mangeri (AC, SAW, O'G, 'RLS', orig. AIAS), Mangeri, Mange:ri ('RLS'), Mangerr (Carroll), Mengerei (SAW, Harris, AIAS), Menngarr (?), Mennagi (Davidson)

No fresh information since the publication of 'RLS' but is most probably now extinct.
