Yirritja moiety.  
Word for 'people' in these dialects: *djarividji*

127\*. *i. Djining*<sup>\*</sup> (O'G: Yulngi) Subgroup

Subgroup named 'Djining' by Wood on the basis of *djining* being the word for 'this'. Its members were decided on the basis of lexical similarity. (Schebeck has named the group 'Djinba' after one of its members). Probably c.200 speakers of Djining dialects remain, living mostly in the area south and south east of Milngimbi where the position of the language is still viable.

- 127a\* Djinba \*\* Milngimbi & Nganggalala (AIAS N97)  
(115) area (RW); Upper Goyder  
River ('RLS')

*Djinba* (AIAS, O'G, 'RLS', SAW), *Jinba* (RW)

Has 83% - 66% lexical affinity with the other three dialects (RW). In 1969 18 speakers were reported at Mountain Valley Station.

'aboriginal person' : *yulngi* (RW)

- 127b\* Dabi<sup>\*</sup> \*\*\*\*

Mentioned for the first time in the literature in Wood's 1972 survey. It is almost extinct, having just a few elderly women speakers left. It has 62% - 66% lexical overlap with other dialects.
