*Yanga* (AIAS), *Janga*: (T), *Jangaa* (O'G, 'RLS')

Salvage amounts may remain in the Normanton area but Breen collected none in his 1972 survey. Sutton maps territory as probably being directly west of *Agwamin* territory. (The comment in 'RLS' it is connected to *Njangga* is incorrect.)

120.2e\* Mbara \*\*\*\* Headwaters of Norman G25 (AIAS G18)  
(100.3g) River; between Rich-  
(1Gr.) mond & Forsyth (PS)

*Mbara* (PS, Sharp), *Ambara* (AC G1, AIAS G21, 'RLS' 1Gr.), *Mitjamba* ('RLS' 100.3g, O'G), *Midjamba* (AC G25, AIAS G18), *Mbarra* (GB)

Sutton discovered his *Mbara* and Tindale's *Mitjamba* are different names for the one dialect which is mutually intelligible with *Yanga*. Breen collected a little material from a limited informant in 1972 and agrees with Sutton that it belongs to Southern Pama. Sutton had earlier recorded a little from the same informant and marked it a case for urgent salvage to allow clarification of some tantalising data.

*Dagalag* (AC, GB, AIAS, PS), *Tagalag* (T, O'G, 'RLS'), *Ndagalag* (PS)

Breen agrees with Sutton's tentative classification that *Dagalag* and *Mbara* are both Southern Paman. Breen interviewed three possible informants in 1972 but was unable to collect anything of significance. There is still hope something may yet be collected.
