

## 128.4\* d. Far Western Mabuïag\*

Laade's general name for this is *Saibailaig*; Lawrie calls it 'Northern Mabuïag' but Simpson's term has been employed here.

128.4a\* Dauan Dauan Island  
(116.2a)

*Dauan* (L, 'RLS', SAW), *Tauan* (L - alt. sp.), *Dausan* ('RLS' 116.2a)

Lawrie has six legends.

128.4b\* Saibai Saibai Island Y109 (AIAS Y3)  
(116.2b)

*Saibai* (L, ML, SAW, AC, AIAS, O'G, 'RLS')

Incorrectly stated in 'RLS' as being on Murray Island and related to *Miriam*. It has no relationship with the Eastern language of *Miriam*. Laade has discussed its position in *Anthropos* (1970) - 'The Position of the language of Saibai'. Lawrie has recorded twenty four legends. Songs have been recorded by West, and Beckett & Jones - the latter in 'Traditional Music of Torres Strait' (AIAS, 1972).

128.4c\* Boigu Talbot Islands, especially Boigu  
Island (L)

*Boigu* (L, ML, 'RLS' under *Saibai*, 116.2b), *Boigulaig-*  
(a1) (L)

Included by Laade, but not by Wurm in his 1970 classification.

Wrongly listed in 'RLS' as part of *Saibai* and wrongly located on Murray Island. Laade has made a number of recordings, including a modern teenage secret language. Lawrie has recorded twenty legends.
