Rigsby found one speaker at Coen and c. 10 elsewhere. He says it has a fairly complex phonology, prenasalized stops, a series of voiced spirants, and 5 vowels, but it has different case endings and a different vocabulary to others in the Lamalamic Group, so doubts if it should be classified here. |

[111.3 Gugu Wara Y123 (AIAS Y80)  
 (44Yr.)

*gugu* 'speech', *wara* 'bad'

*Koko Wara* (listed incorrectly in 'RLS' as alt. name for *Aghu Tharnggala*, 109.2), *wara* (AC, AIAS, 'RLS' 44Yr.) (Roth's *Koko Wara* is modern *Bariman Gudinma* - BAS; see 111.1\*), *Coo-Coo-Warra*

Its meaning of 'bad talk' may mean it is only a general derogatory name throughout the area, like *wik way* is further north - see 80Yr. |

112\*. c. *Lamalama Subgroup*\*

112a\* Coastal Lamalama \* Mouth of Annie River  
 (33Yr.) (LMW)

*Kankanda* (SAW), *Kankanta* (LMW), probably *Kokolamalama* (Hale & T), *Walmbaria* ('RLS' 33Yr.) (Flinders Island term for *Lamalama* - PS)

Rigsby (1972) found no remaining speakers. West recorded a *Kankanda* word list.

Word for 'man' : *ba*
